Resolution No. 2006-017

**A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Riverbank
Designating the City Council and the District 1 Supervisor of the
Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors as the Local Redevelopment Authority
(LRA) for the Riverbank Army Ammunition Plant.**

Whereas, On May 16, 2005 the Secretary of Defense published in the Federal Register and transmitted to the Congressional Defense Committees and the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission (BRAC) a list of Military installations that the Secretary of Defense recommends for closure or realignment; and

Whereas, The Riverbank Army Ammunition Plant was placed on the list of military installations recommended for closure or realignment; and

Whereas, On September 8, 2005, the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission presented its Final Report to President Bush; and

Whereas, The Riverbank Army Ammunition Plant was included in the Final Report of military installations recommended for closure; and

Whereas, On September 15, 2005, President Bush concurred with and sent the 2005 Base Closure and Realignment Commission's Final Report to Congress for legislative review; and

Whereas, On November 9, 2005, Congress allowed the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission's recommended list of military installations to be closed or realigned to pass into law; and

Whereas, Under the applicable base closure regulation, a Local Redevelopment Authority (LRA) must be comprised of representatives from jurisdictions with zoning authority over the closing base; and

Whereas, The City of Riverbank is in the process of annexing the Riverbank Army Ammunition Plant, which is within the City of Riverbanks "Sphere of Influence." and

Whereas, The City Council is a duly elected body of the City of Riverbank, and as such, will be the only jurisdiction with zoning over the Riverbank Army Ammunition Plant and represents the citizens of Riverbank; and

Whereas, The County Board of Supervisors is a duly elected body of Stanislaus County and the supervisor of District One represents the voters of the City of Riverbank

and the annexation procedure will be completed after the due process, and during this process the property would remain in the zoning jurisdiction of Stanislaus County, the elected Supervisor from the 1st district will also be included as a member of the LRA; and

Whereas, The designated LRA for the Riverbank Army Ammunition Plant, will prepare a Re-Use Plan as required under the base closure law and regulation to serve as the primary planning document that will establish the vision for the base redevelopment, articulating community goals that will guide the planning process and identify economically and environmentally feasible land uses for the base redevelopment program, balancing the other community development objectives; and

Whereas, The recognized LRA, will establish a Citizen's Advisory Committee, which will, during the redevelopment planning process, solicit input from a broad and inclusive group of community stakeholders interested in redevelopment of the base; and


Whereas, The City of Riverbank City Council, requests that the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors establish a policy when a base closure occurs that the Stanislaus Board of Supervisors support the annexation of the facility to the adjacent city when the military base is located within the sphere of influence of said city.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that the City Council of City of Riverbank does hereby adopt the following:


1. Resolution designating the City Council of the City of Riverbank and the District 1 Supervisor from the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors, as the Local Redevelopment Authority (LRA) for the Riverbank Army Ammunition Plant.
2. Requests that the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors adopt a policy to support the annexation of military facilities to the adjacent city when the military base is located within the sphere of influence of said city.
